OUR CLUBS



In our Model United Nations program, we are called to be servants of the world following Jesus's example. Christ taught us that true leadership means putting others before ourselves and working for the common good of all humanity. Just as Jesus came to serve rather than be served, our MUN delegates learn to advocate not for personal glory but for the well-being of nations and peoples they represent. Participants represent countries, debate global issues, and develop diplomacy and leadership skills.

### ASHT N 20 YOUTH IN ACTION 30

In the Youth in Action program, we invite everyone to lovingly care for the planet that the Lord has given us as our home. Genesis teaches us that God entrusted humanity with the stewardship of His creation, calling us to "cultivate and keep it" (Genesis 2:15). Our program helps young people understand that environmental care is not separate from but integral to our Christian witness.

Jesus demonstrated a profound connection to nature, often using creation in His parables and seeking natural settings for prayer and teaching. Following His example, our students learn to see ecological responsibility as an expression of love for both the Creator and our neighbors worldwide. The program emphasizes that caring for our common home is an act of justice and compassion, particularly for the poor who often suffer most from environmental degradation.

Through hands-on conservation projects, education, and advocacy, Youth in Action participants develop a biblically-informed environmental ethic that honors God's gift of creation. They learn that authentic Christian leadership includes ensuring that future generations can also enjoy and steward the natural wonders that reveal God's glory Unleashing Potential, Transforming Futures

The Debate program teaches us how sound arguments – rather than personal attacks – can lead to solving problems, reflecting biblical wisdom about communication. Scripture advises us to be "quick to listen, slow to speak, and slow to become angry" (James 1:19), principles that are foundational to effective debate.

Jesus himself was a master of reasoned discourse, often responding to challenges with thought-provoking questions and parables rather than hostile rhetoric. Following His example, our debate program trains students to engage respectfully with opposing viewpoints, seeking truth rather than victory. Participants learn that the goal of debate is not to defeat opponents but to collectively discover better solutions through the exchange of ideas. Challenge ideas and sharpen critical thinking in structured arguments, fostering public speaking prowess and persuasive communication.



The Transforming Hearts program teaches members that service extends far beyond simple actions - it requires a fundamental change in our hearts. As Jesus said, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Matthew 6:21). This program helps students understand that true service begins with inner transformation.

The program creates space for deep spiritual growth, helping young leaders recognize that their capacity to influence others positively is directly connected to their willingness to be transformed from within. Rather than viewing service as an obligation, they come to see it as a natural expression of a heart being continually shaped by divine love.

This tournament was more than just a competition, it was a celebration of debate, learning, and growth.














